LAYING ON OF HANDS AND THE PRAYER OF ORDINATION

Having prayed with the people and in communion with all the saints, the Bishop lays his hands on the candidate and prays the words of consecration, conferring the Holy Spirit.

THE COMMUNION RITE

Holy Communion

All Roman Catholics in a state of Grace are heartily encouraged to receive Holy Communion. Because Roman Catholics believe that the celebration of the Eucharist is a sign of the reality of the oneness of faith, life, and worship, Fellow-Christians of those churches with whom we are not yet fully united are not admitted to Holy Communion, although we welcome them and pray our common baptism and the action of the Holy Spirit in this Eucharist will draw us closer and help dispel the sad divisions that separate us. We also welcome Non-Christians, and – although we cannot admit them to Holy Communion – ask them to offer their prayers for the peace and unity of the human family.
